

PhD Seminar Presentations

From the third year onwards there is an obligation to present your work at least once a year in one of the seminars at UC3M. In the case of third year students, if the work is still “too much in progress”, you are welcome to present half a seminar by sharing the available slot with a fellow student.

Most students present in the “student seminar”, but some advanced students may also present in the “i.i.d seminar” (which normally is reserved for faculty). This is especially true of students who are on the job market. They should plan to present in the “i.i.d seminar” during the months of September-December of the year they will be on the market.

Also remember that each student, together with his or her thesis advisor, should ensure a good audience. To do so, feel free for you (or your advisor) to get in touch with the faculty you would appreciate to have in your seminar. This is a very important aspect. It is the responsibility of the advisor and the student to get an audience with enough faculty members.

For the seminar, make copies of your paper and/or slides for the faculty members that are present. After the seminar, make sure to follow up with the faculty members that gave you relevant comments.

It is extremely important to regularly present your work to the Department. Getting used to presenting, receiving criticisms, and interacting with more people than your advisor are all key to your success in graduate school.
